

POLICY INVOLVEMENT

2021 Utah State Legislative Session.

- <u>House Bill 102</u> "Contraceptives for Inmates"
 - This legislation would make contraceptive methods available to people who are experiencing incarceration. The bill was introduced in the 2020 session because of my dissertation research on the topic. I provided research briefs for the sponsoring legislator and provided expert testimony in support of the bill in 2020. The bill did not pass in 2020, due to fiscal note concerns but was reintroduced in 2021, passed, and has been signed into law by the Governor.
- Senate Bill 128 "Family Planning Services Amendments"
 - This bill would expand contraceptive access for low-income Utahns. I was part of the expert team that provided data and legislator education about contraception as essential health care that resulted in the passage of House Bill 12 in 2018. SB 128 would increase eligibility to people with incomes to 250% the Federal Poverty Level. It did not pass and will be reintroduced in the 2022 session.
